
Overcoming challenges at Local 860 continues to be our way of life. We can all be proud that our great Union continues to succeed despite them, and has done so for 75 years.





The Innerbelt Bridge Project crews have completed most of the adjacent roadway work and I-90 bridge expansions that will carry traffic onto the new bridge when it opens late in 2013. Over the winter and into spring and summer, they will continue to erect structural steel on the main bridge. Forming and pouring sections of the bridge deck will continue in the spring and summer, as well.



In August, Governor John R. Kasich announced that an innovative financing option to eliminate construction delays for the second Innerbelt Bridge.

ODOT will use a public private partnership - or P3 - that will allow contractors to finance more than \$300 million needed to demolish the existing bridge as well as design and construct the new eastbound bridge. ODOT will then pay the contractor back over time. The funding plan will allow demolition of the existing bridge and construction of the new eastbound bridge to begin immediately after completion of the new westbound bridge. Both new bridges could carry traffic as soon as late 2016.

SHOREWAY WEST

Lakefront West Project, commonly known as the West 73rd/Shoreway underpass recently delayed due to budget problems, is now set to get back on track. Funding for the project comes by way of NOACA Governing Board's approval of \$204 million in transportation projects, which secures federal funding and locks down the 2013 and 2014 construction seasons.

Not only would it provide numerous job opportunities to 860, but the project would increase access to the lakefront by extending West 73rd Street north to the lake. That would involve digging a tunnel under

railroad tracks to create access for cars, pedestrians and bicyclists.

OPPORTUNITY CORRIDOR

The Opportunity
Corridor Project is
still underway. The
35 mph boulevard,
estimated last
year to cost \$220
million, would
move thousands
of commuters and
visitors from south
and west of Cleveland

more quickly to the Cleveland Clinic and University Hospitals, as well as the educational and cultural institutions in University Circle.

More good news for Local 860 is that road's potential to spur development in surrounding areas. A final Public Hearing is tentatively set for March 2013 to approve the final design.

NEORSD

The Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District has several project bid openings scheduled for 2013 with a total estimated budget over \$160 million. These include Euclid Creek Pump Station, Dugway/ West Interceptor Relief and Facility Improvements at various locations.
