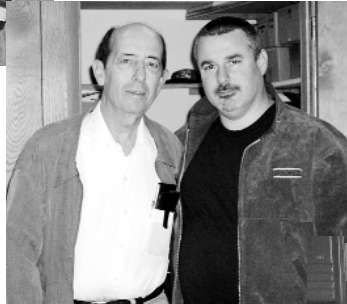

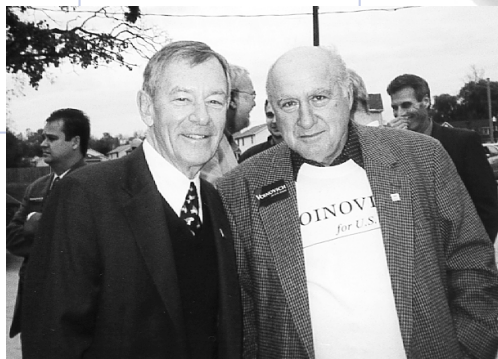

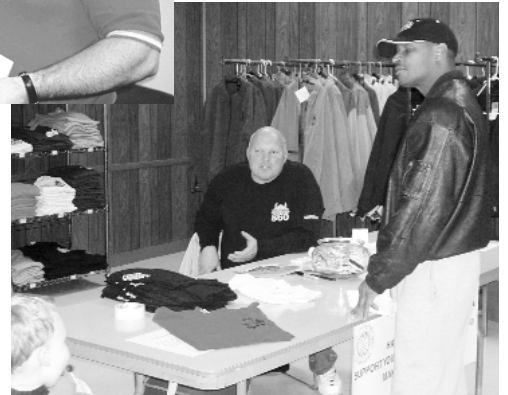

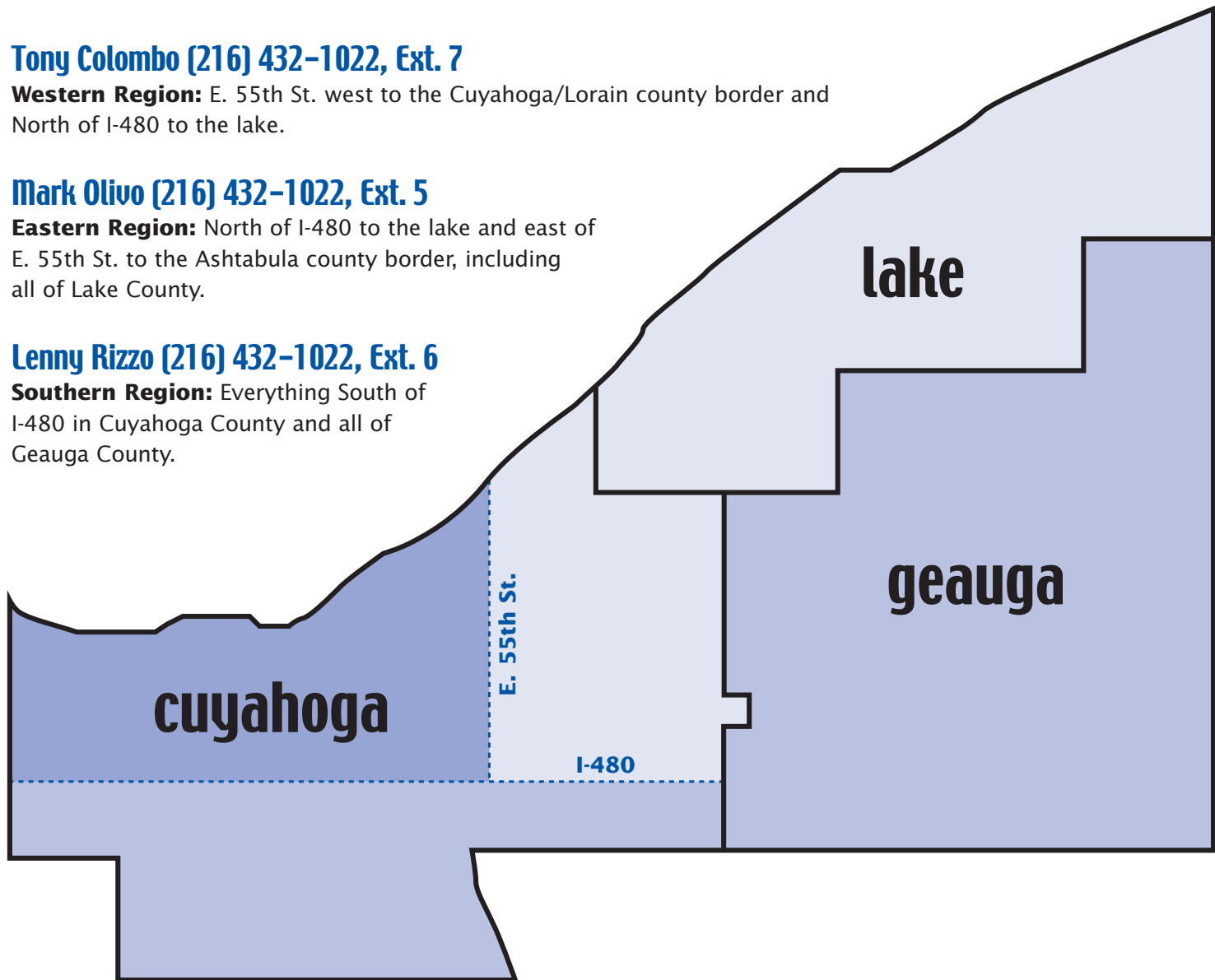
Western Region: E. 55th St. west to the Cuyahoga/Lorain county border and North of I-480 to the lake.

Southern Region: Everything South of I-480 in Cuyahoga County and all of Geauga County.



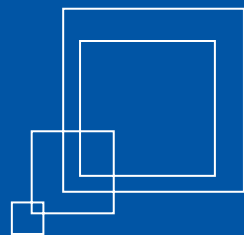
